### November Meeting – Steve Ittel

### Directions to the Brandywine Town Center (BTC)

The meeting hall is a stand-alone building, removed from the commercial area, with a large glass dome on top.

*From Route 202 Southbound:* Shortly after crossing into Delaware on Route 202 southbound, turn left onto Naamans Road at the intersection bounded by an Exxon station and the Days Inn. At the second light, turn left into the Brandywine Town Center (You will see a large Target store), turn right, and follow the outer parking lot ring road to the meeting hall.

*From I-95 Northbound and 202 Northbound:* Take Exit 8 Concord Pike North. Just beyond Concord Mall at the Days Inn, turn right onto Naamans Road and follow the directions above.

*From I-95 Southbound:* Take the I-495 and Naamans Road exit just after passing into Delaware. Take Naamans Road westbound. After passing Grubb Road, you will take the next right into Brandywine Town Center. Look for the meeting center described above. ### Sergio Cuan Lecture, Demo and Workshop.

The October BBS meeting was one of the finest we have had. Sergio started off with a slide presentation about his collection, demonstrating the progress of his deciduous trees over time. His trees underwent significant initial modifications to promote the final look that he wanted to achieve years down the line. His foresight was impressive and I really appreciated his explanation of the differences in approach to deciduous versus conifer bonsai.

In the next portion of the meeting he styled a hedge maple that Mark Huf had supplied. The transformation was not to yield a well-styled tree as is often the case with bonsai demonstrations. Rather, the significant cuts that were made were at carefully chosen locations to promote buds that would ultimately transform an awkward foundation which was the basis for a wonderful and graceful final tree. His final recommendation was that next spring, it be hit hard with Osmocote to really push all of the remaining, carefully selected buds. This was an approach that I had not heard before.

Possibly the best part of the meeting was after most of the club members had gone. There were only seven of us remaining at the end of the day. But this allowed very detailed pruning and styling suggestions for the future of the trees that members provided. Most members had only one tree to work on, but one lucky member had three different trees that got significant attention. I was sorry that so many of you had missed this opportunity, but the smaller number of trees allowed ample time for discussion and appreciation.

## Regional Club Show at Longwood Gardens

Longwood Gardens is planning a regional bonsai show, June 24-29, 2026. It will feature 34 of the finest displays from five regional clubs including BBS. The weekend of June 26-28 will include: demonstrations and lectures, vendors, cocktail reception (June 27) and auction of significant bonsai material (June 27).

BBS will enter several significant trees in this show so we should be thinking about how the trees will be selected. Those trees will probably need some early prep work. We have full displays: tree, stand, companion, scroll and variations thereof. There will be a People's Choice Award for the best display in show. It is anticipated that the owners of the selected trees will need to provide significant information about the displays ahead of time - things like: species; how tall from the table top to the top of the tree; which way it slants (to decide which side of the display table it will be on); makers of the various components, etc.

BBS will also be contributing significant tree sitting for the show because we live the closest, but other clubs will also be contributing tree watching. Other clubs are handling vendors, tree arrangement, the auction, etc.

**Share a Tree:** Do you have a tree of which you are particularly proud? Maybe one that is flowering, fruiting or showing brilliant colors or maybe just one that you want to share. Bring it to a meeting regardless the topic of the meeting. We can always carve out five minutes for you to do a show-and-tell with it. It doesn't have to be display ready or a "masterpiece".
